

A 150Mbps router can be used with a 100Mbps fiber optic cable

A 150Mbps router cannot increase your internet speed beyond the 100Mbps limit of your fiber optic connection; the maximum speed will be capped at 100Mbps.

Router vs Fiber Speed: Even if your router supports 150Mbps, your 100Mbps fiber optic connection will be the limiting factor. The router can only distribute the available bandwidth, so the maximum internet speed achievable on any device will be 100Mbps over wired or wireless connections . **Ethernet Port Limitations:** Many routers have Fast Ethernet ports (10/100Mbps) or Gigabit ports (10/100/1000Mbps). If your router has only 100Mbps WAN or LAN ports, it cannot exceed 100Mbps, regardless of its wireless signal rating . To fully utilize speeds above 100Mbps, a router with Gigabit ports is required. **Wi-Fi Considerations:** Wireless speeds are influenced by the router's Wi-Fi standard, distance, interference, and client device capabilities. A router rated for 150Mbps may provide that speed under ideal conditions, but the actual internet speed will still be capped at 100Mbps due to the fiber connection . **Fiber Optic Cable Type:** For a 100Mbps fiber link, either multi-mode or single-mode fiber can be used depending on distance. Multi-mode is cost-effective for short distances (under 2 km), while single-mode is better for longer distances or higher reliability . The fiber type does not increase the speed beyond the 100Mbps transceiver rating.
