- **Modulators:** Encode electrical data onto the light wave, shaping the signal for optical transmission. Electro-optic modulators are commonly used for high-speed applications .
- **Amplifiers:** Boost the optical signal to counteract losses over long distances without converting it back to electrical form. Examples include Erbium-Doped Fiber Amplifiers (EDFAs), .
- **Photodetectors:** Convert the received optical signals back into electrical signals for processing, completing the communication cycle .
- **Control Software/Firmware:** Optimizes device performance, manages signal integrity, and facilitates network management, ensuring reliable operation in compl...
