Mozambique's optical cable infrastructure combines international submarine cables and national fiber networks, enhancing connectivity from Maputo to Nacala and linking the country to regional and global networks.

Submarine Cable Connectivity

Mozambique is connected to several major submarine fiber optic systems. The EASSy (East African Submarine Cable System) runs approximately 10,000 km along the East African coast, linking Sudan to South Africa with landing points in Mozambique, providing high-capacity international connectivity and reducing reliance on costly routing through Europe or the US . The SEACOM cable similarly connects Mozambique to global networks, improving internet speeds and reducing costs, particularly in the Maputo region . The 2Africa submarine cable, the largest in the world, recently landed in both Maputo (south) and Nacala (north), connecting Mozambique to 33 countries across Africa, Europe, and Asia . This cable provides a direct international outlet for faster, more reliable internet services, supporting the growth of the digital economy and enabling Vodacom to expand broadband access across the country .
