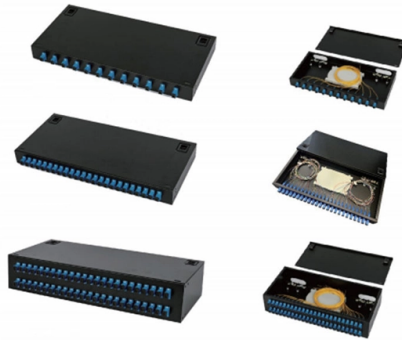


Are cable trays considered concealed works



Article Overview

Cables can be considered concealed works when installed within walls, ceilings, or floors, but cable trays are generally not classified as concealed because they are open support structures, even if positioned above ceilings or behind partitions.

Concealed Cables

Concealed cables are those installed in such a way that they are hidden from view, typically within walls, floors, or ceilings. According to BS 7671, concealed wiring must be installed to minimize mechanical damage from impact, abrasion, penetration, tension, or compression during installation, use, or maintenance . For example, PVC-insulated cables in domestic installations must be positioned at least 50 mm from surfaces to avoid accidental penetration by nails or screws . Concealed cables may also require adherence to prescribed “safe zones” within walls or partitions to ensure protection .

Cable Trays

Cable trays, on the other hand, are open or partially open support structures designed to route and support electrical cables . They are typically installed above ceilings, along walls, or in industrial spaces to provide organized pathways for power and data cables. While cable trays may be positioned out of direct sight, they are not fully enclosed within the building structure and remain accessible for inspection, maintenance, and future cable additions . Their open design allows for ventilation a...
