

Are fiber optic cables and router network cables compatible

Fiber optic cables are compatible with routers, but typically require an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) or a fiber-ready router to convert light signals into electrical signals your router can use.

How Compatibility Works

Fiber optic internet transmits data using light signals through glass or plastic fibers, unlike traditional copper-based connections that use electrical signals. Because routers are designed to handle electrical signals, directly connecting a fiber optic cable to a standard router is usually not possible. Instead, an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) is used to convert the optical signal into an Ethernet signal that your router can interpret .

Router Requirements

To ensure compatibility with fiber internet:

- **WAN/Ethernet Port:** Your router must have a Gigabit Ethernet WAN port to connect to the ONT . Routers designed for DSL or cable (with phone line or coaxial inputs) will not work.
- **Speed Support:** The router should support the speed tier of your fiber plan. Older routers (Wi-Fi 4 or 5) may limit performance, while Wi-Fi 6 or 6E routers are recommended for high-speed fiber connections
