

Cable tray What is the spacing between the support legs



Article Overview

For standard horizontal cable tray runs, support legs should typically be spaced 1.5 to 3 meters apart, with closer spacing required for heavy loads, bends, or vertical runs.

Horizontal Support Spacing

For straight horizontal sections, the distance between cable tray supports (legs or hangers) generally ranges from 1.5 meters to 3 meters depending on the tray type, material, and cable load. Heavy-duty or long-span trays may allow supports up to 6 meters or more, but this must be verified against the manufacturer's load capacity chart to prevent sagging or mechanical stress on the cables. At corners, bends, or T-junctions, supports should be installed on each side symmetrically to maintain stability.

Vertical and Angled Runs

For vertical cable tray runs, supports should be fixed to the building structure at intervals preferably less than 2 meters to ensure stability and prevent undue stress on the cables. When transitioning from horizontal to vertical runs, additional supports may be required to maintain structural integrity.

- Hanging rod supports should have a minimum diameter of 8 mm and be placed at...
