Cable tray cut-out connections allow safe branching or equipment feed-offs while maintaining structural integrity and cable protection.

Purpose of Cut-Out Connections

Cut-out connections in cable trays are used to branch cables from a main tray to equipment, panels, or secondary trays. They ensure that cables are routed efficiently without sharp bends, excessive stress, or interference with other cables, which could compromise performance or safety .

Methods for Creating Cut-Outs

- Pre-fabricated Tee or Cross Fittings: Many ladder or mesh trays come with T, Y, or cross fittings that allow branching without cutting the tray itself .
- Field Cut-Outs: When a custom branch is needed, a section of the tray can be cut using appropriate tools (e.g., saws or nibblers for metal trays). The edges should be deburred and smoothed to prevent cable damage .
- Splice Plates and Connectors: After cutting, splice plates or tray connectors are used to join the cut section to the main tray. These maintain mechanical strength and alignment .
- Mesh Tray Magic Connectors: For wire-mesh trays, specialized Magic connectors allow quick attachment of branches without welding or drilling, preserving corrosion protection and structural integrity .
