Cables in cable trays are generally not run through conduits, but conduit may be required in certain environments for added protection.

Cable Tray vs Conduit

Cable trays are open structural pathways designed to support and organize multiple cables, allowing for easy installation, maintenance, and heat dissipation due to air circulation around the cables . Conduits, by contrast, are enclosed tubes that fully protect cables from mechanical damage, moisture, chemicals, UV exposure, and other environmental hazards . While conduits provide superior protection, they are more labor-intensive to install and maintain, especially for large cable counts .

Tray Cables in Cable Trays

Tray cables (TC, TC-ER, and similar types) are specifically designed for use in cable trays. They are multi-conductor cables with robust jacketing suitable for industrial and commercial environments. These cables can be installed directly in cable trays without conduit, provided they are supported, secured, and protected from excessive mechanical damage according to code . This open installation allows for easy access for maintenance, inspection, and future cable additions .
