Overview

The split ratio indicates how the input signal is divided. The power of the input . A beam splitter (or beamsplitter, power splitter) is an optical device which can split an incident light beam (e. a laser beam) into two (or sometimes more) beams, which may or may not have the same optical power (radiant flux). It is a crucial part of many optical experimental and measurement systems, such as interferometers, also finding widespread application in fibre optic telecommunications. For example, in quantum information the beam splitter plays essential roles in teleportation, bell measure-ments, entanglement and in fundamental studies of the photon. Beamsplitters are often classified according to their construction: cube or plate. This principle allows a single input light beam to be split into N output light beams.

While most beam splitters have only two output ports, there are also beam splitters with multiple outputs. They may be realized, for example, based on diffractive optics.

What are Beamsplitters?

In addition to an R/T ratio, some beamsplitters may also have a specified extinction ratio. This is defined as the ratio of transmitted p-polarized light to s-polarized light, or T_p/T_s .

In its most common form, a cube, a beam splitter is made from two triangular glass prisms which are glued together at their base using polyester, epoxy, or urethane-based adhesives. (Before these synthetic resins, natural ones were used, e.g. Canada balsam.) The thickness of the resin layer is adjusted such that (for a certain wavelength) half of the light incident through one "port" (i.e., face of the cube) is reflected and th...
