

# Can a cable management rack still be used after being cut



## Article Overview

A cable management rack can sometimes still be used after being cut, but its structural integrity, mounting stability, and compliance with standards must be carefully evaluated before reuse.

### Structural and Functional Considerations

When a cable management rack is cut, its mechanical strength and ability to support cables and equipment may be compromised. If the cut section affects the rack's frame or attachment points, it may no longer safely support cables, especially in high-density or heavy installations.

### Safety and Compliance

- Cable strain or sagging, which can damage cables or connectors
  - Reduced airflow, potentially causing overheating of network equipment
  - Non-compliance with standards, such as DIN EN 50173 for structured cabling, which may affect audits or insurance coverage
- Before reuse, ensure that the cut rack does not create sharp edges or points that could damage cables or injure personnel. Any exposed metal should be deburred or covered....
