Article Overview

A spectrometer cannot autonomously interpret its own readings; it measures light interactions and produces raw spectral data that must be analyzed by software or a human operator.

How a Spectrometer Works

A spectrometer is an analytical instrument that measures the interaction between light and a sample, producing data such as absorbance, transmittance, or intensity across different wavelengths . It consists of a light source, a monochromator to select specific wavelengths, a sample compartment, and a detector that records the light passing through or emitted by the sample . The output is typically a spectrum, which is a graph of light intensity versus wavelength.

Data Interpretation

While the spectrometer generates the raw readings, it does not inherently interpret them. The readings indicate how much light is absorbed or transmitted at each wavelength, but understanding what these values mean—such as identifying chemical concentrations, molecular structures, or material properties—requires:

- Human analysis, where a scientist examines the spectrum and compares it to known standards .
- Software analysis, which can process the spectral data using algorithms, calibrati...
