

Can different cable trays share the same support frame



Article Overview

Yes, multiple cable trays can share the same support frame if the frame is designed to handle the combined load and complies with NEC and manufacturer guidelines.

Structural Considerations

Cable trays are supported by frames, brackets, or hangers that must be designed to carry the weight of the trays plus the cables they contain. When multiple trays share a single frame, the total load must be calculated, including the tray weight, cable weight, and any additional dynamic or environmental factors such as vibration or seismic activity. The support frame should be sized and reinforced to prevent excessive deflection or bending, and cross members should be positioned to distribute the load evenly.

NEC and Safety Compliance

According to NEC Article 392, cable trays are considered support structures, not raceways, and must be installed to maintain safety and reliability. Shared support frames are permissible as long as:

- The frame can safely carry the combined weight of all trays and cables.
- Tray fill limits are not exceeded for any individual tray.
- Proper grounding and bonding are maintained for metallic trays.
- Adequate spacing is provided to prevent overheating and allow maintenance access.
