Importance of Segregation

Routing high-voltage (power) and low-voltage (signal or control) cables together in the same tray can lead to electromagnetic interference (EMI), cross-talk, or signal distortion, especially in dense or congested installations . Segregation ensures that sensitive low-voltage circuits, such as data or instrumentation lines, are not affected by the magnetic fields generated by high-voltage power cables . It also reduces the risk of accidental voltage crossover, which can damage equipment or compromise safety .

Best Practices for Cable Tray Installation

- **Separate Trays or Compartments:** Use dedicated trays for high-voltage and low-voltage cables. If a single tray must be used, employ divider brackets or compartmentalized trays to maintain physical separation .
- **Tray Material Selection:** Indoor trays can be painted steel or galvanized steel, while outdoor or corrosive environments may require stainless steel, hot-dip galvanized steel, aluminum alloy, or fiberglass-reinforced plastic .
- **Mechanical Support:** Ensure trays are level, plumb, and securely mounted. Horizo...
