A1: The recommended temperature range for a cold aisle typically falls between 64°F (18°C) and 80°F (27°C). However, this range can vary depending on the specific equipment in use, so it's essential to consult manufacturer guidelines. Cold aisles are formed by the space between the front faces of two rows of IT equipment racks. The returning air is warmer and drier when it reaches the AC coil. Why is Aisle Containment so Important?

Aisle containment is an important environmental control standard in the. An aisle containment system is a simple way to improve cooling efficiency in hot aisle/cold aisle rack configurations. Essentially creating a room within the aisle, the system helps keep hot and cold air separated to make existing air conditioning systems in data center and edge-of-network. ASHRAE recommends keeping server rooms between 64. This aisle typically houses the rear sides of server racks, with servers expelling hot air toward this space.
