To connect a fiber optic splitter to another splitter, use compatible fiber patch cables to link the output of the primary splitter to the input of the secondary splitter while monitoring signal loss.

Understanding Fiber Optic Splitters

A fiber optic splitter is a passive device that divides a single optical signal into multiple outputs without requiring power, making it ideal for FTTH and PON networks . Splitters can be FBT (Fused Biconical Taper) or PLC (Planar Lightwave Circuit) types, with FBT being cost-effective for low-ratio splits like 1x2 or 1x4 . Each splitter introduces some insertion loss, typically around 3.5 dB for a 1x2 splitter, which must be considered when cascading .

Steps to Connect Splitters

- **Prepare Equipment:** Ensure you have compatible splitters, fiber patch cables (SC/APC, LC, or other connectors), and optionally a power meter to test signal strength .
- **Connect Primary Splitter:** Attach the main fiber line from the ONT or central office to the input port of the primary splitter.
- **Link to Secondary Splitter:** Use a fiber patch cable to connect one output of the primary splitter to the input of the secondary splitter. This creates a cascaded setup to expand the number of outputs .
- **Connect End Devices:** Attach fiber cables from the secondary splitter outputs to t...
