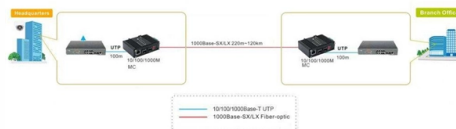


Different switches have incompatible optical ports

Switch optical port incompatibility usually arises from mismatched SFP modules, fiber types, wavelengths, or unsupported transceivers.

Common Causes of Incompatibility

- **SFP Module and Switch Mismatch** Optical modules must be compatible with the switch model. Using third-party or non-certified SFPs can lead to link failures, intermittent connectivity, or degraded performance. Many switches require OEM-approved modules, and even modules of the same form factor (e.g., SFP vs SFP+) may not operate correctly if the speed or electrical specifications differ .
- **Speed and Port Type Mismatch** SFP modules are designed for specific speeds. For example, a 1G SFP module may not function properly in a 10G SFP+ port, and vice versa. Some SFP+ modules can support multiple speeds, but most optical modules cannot interoperate across different speed standards without limitations .
- **Fiber Type and Wavelength Issues** Single-mode (SMF) and multimode (MMF) fibers require matching optical modules. SMF modules typically operate at 1310nm or 1550nm, while MMF modules operate at 850nm. Connecting mismatched fiber types or modules with different wavelengths can prevent the link from coming up and may damage the transceivers .
- **Optical Power and Distance Limitations** Modules have specific transmit and receive power ranges. If the fiber length exceeds the supported distance or the optical power is too low or too high, the port may remain down. Long-distance modules connected to short-distance modules may require optical attenuators to prevent overloading .
