

Do cable trays require a permit

Cable trays are permitted for use in any type of building or structure, provided they comply with the relevant installation and support requirements outlined in NEC Article 392. NEC Article 392 outlines the key rules for installing and maintaining industrial cable tray systems. Here's what you need to know: Cable Types: Only use. Most construction in New York City requires approval and permits from the Department of Buildings. Some minor alterations may be done without a work permit. For example, installing new kitchen cabinets doesn't require a permit but contractors must have a Department of Consumer and Worker Protection. An electrical permit is required for most electrical work, including handling of electrical wires that is performed in a residential home or business. In addition, this document contains several references to provisions of the National Electric Code. Answer: No. NEC section 300-8 does not permit any tube, pipe, or equal for water, air gas, drainage, steam, or any service other than electrical in raceways or cable trays containing. Metal raceways, cable trays, cable armor, cable sheath, enclosures, frames, fittings, and other metal noncurrent-carrying parts that are to serve as grounding conductors, with or without the use of supplementary equipment grounding conductors, shall be effectively bonded where necessary to ensure.
