

Do wall-mounted cable trays require support brackets



Article Overview

Wall-mounted cable trays generally require brackets or supports to ensure stability, though some trays with integrated mounting features can be installed without additional brackets.

Standard Wall-Mounted Installation

For most cable trays, wall-mounted brackets, supports, or hangers are necessary to secure the tray against the wall and prevent sagging or shifting over time . Properly spaced brackets maintain the structural integrity of the tray, especially when carrying heavy cables. Typical spacing for standard cable trays is 1.5 to 3 meters (approximately 4-10 feet), depending on the tray type, load, and environmental conditions . Brackets also allow for adjustments and help keep cables organized and accessible.

Alternatives and Exceptions

Some cable tray systems, such as the 501 Series Wall Mount Cable Tray, feature integrated mounting rings along the center spine, which allow the tray to be attached directly to the wall without additional brackets or hanging hardware . These designs simplify installation and reduce the need for extra support components, but they are specific to certain tray models.

The tray is then attached to the bracket using either a bracket clamp (see page C35) in the case of the "L" bracket or integrated bend-down tabs for the TabLok bracket.
