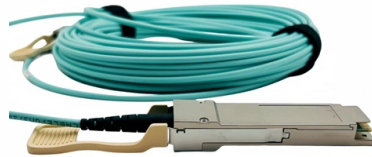


Does fiber optic communication require electricity

How Fiber Optic Communication Works

Fiber optic communication transmits data as pulses of light through thin strands of glass or plastic, rather than using electrical signals like copper cables . The light acts as a carrier wave, modulated to encode information such as voice, video, or internet data . Because the fiber itself is passive, it does not consume electricity to carry these light signals .

- **Transmitters:** Devices like lasers or LEDs convert electrical signals into light pulses to send data through the fiber .
- **Receivers:** Optical receivers convert incoming light signals back into electrical signals for computers, routers, or other devices .
- **Amplifiers and Network Nodes:** In long-distance or high-capacity networks, optical amplifiers and distribution nodes boost signal strength and integrity, all of which require electricity
