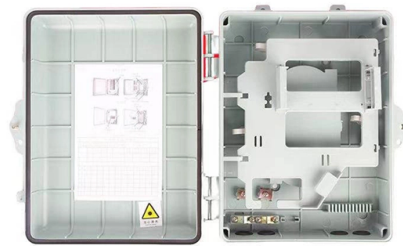

Optical fiber cables transmit data as light signals rather than electrical current, making them fundamentally different from traditional electrical cables . They consist of a core, cladding, and protective coating, and rely on total internal reflection to carry optical signals over long distances with minimal loss . Because they do not conduct electricity, they are immune to electromagnetic interference (EMI) and can safely operate alongside high-voltage electrical lines .

Use in Instrumentation

- Transmit high-speed data between sensors, transmitters, and control systems
 - Connect optically-based sensing elements to electronic instrumentation
 - Provide accurate signal transmission in environments with high electrical noise or hazardous conditions
