Purpose and Function

An emergency switch, also known as an E-stop, is a fail-safe control device installed in power distribution boxes to quickly interrupt electrical power to machinery or systems in case of an emergency, such as risk of injury, equipment malfunction, or hazardous conditions (). It ensures that power can be cut off instantly, preventing accidents and minimizing damage to equipment. These switches are commonly used in industrial, commercial, and public environments where rapid shutdown may be required ().

Components of an Emergency Switch

- Actuator: The part operated by the user, which can be a push button, pull cord, or twist knob, depending on the application ().
- Contact Block: Transmits the electrical signal from the actuator to the control circuit, opening or closing contacts to interrupt power ().
- Enclosure: Protects internal components, often made of durable, fire-resistant materials to withstand harsh environments ().
- Mounting Bracket: Secures the switch to a panel or surface for easy access ().
- Labeling: Provides clear instructions for operation and safety ()....
