How Optical Fiber Works in Escalators

Optical fiber cables transmit data as pulses of light through thin strands of glass or plastic, offering high bandwidth, fast transmission, and immunity to electromagnetic interference, which is critical in environments with motors and electrical equipment like escalators . Unlike copper cables, fiber optics maintain signal integrity over long distances and are less prone to deterioration from electrical noise .

Cable Construction for Moving Systems

Escalator optical fiber cables are designed to withstand continuous flexing and mechanical stress. Typical construction includes:

- Tight-buffered fiber cores to protect the glass strands from bending stress .
 - Aramid reinforcement for tensile strength and durability .
 - Steel strength members to support the cable under tension and prevent stretching .
 - Protective outer sheath to shield the fibers from abrasion and environmental factors .
- This construction ensures that the cable can flex repeatedly as the escalator moves without breaking or losing signal quality .
