Fiber optic cables are primarily made from ultra-pure silica glass for the core and cladding, with protective coatings and structural materials like acrylate, aramid yarn, and polyethylene for durability and performance.

Core and Cladding

The core is the central part of the fiber where light signals travel, typically made from ultra-pure silica glass (SiO_2), sometimes doped with germanium or phosphorus to adjust the refractive index and minimize signal loss over long distances . Surrounding the core is the cladding, also made of silica glass but with a slightly lower refractive index, ensuring total internal reflection to keep light confined within the core . Plastic cores are occasionally used for short-distance or flexible applications, though they have higher attenuation than glass .

Coating and Buffer

To protect the delicate fiber, a dual-layer coating is applied, usually made from UV-cured acrylate. The primary coating cushions the fiber, while the secondary coating provides mechanical protection and environmental resistance . Additional buffer layers may include polyethylene (PE) or polybutylene terephthalate (PBT) to enhance durability and facilitate handling during installation .
