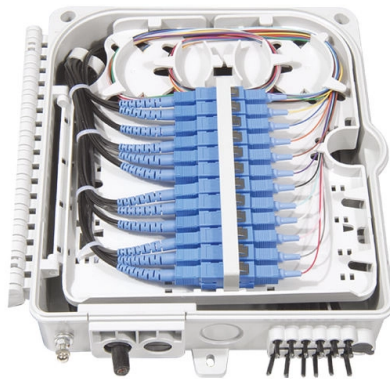

Fiber optic dust caps are the primary method for protecting connector end faces when patch cords are not in use. They prevent dust, dirt, and debris from contaminating the polished fiber tip, which is critical because even microscopic particles can cause signal loss or increased attenuation . Dust caps are available for all standard connector types, including LC, SC, FC, ST, and MTP, and can be used on both single-mode and multi-mode fibers . High-quality dust caps are made from durable, high-temperature-resistant, and anti-static materials to ensure long-lasting protection . Some designs include storage boxes or handles for easy organization and to prevent loss .

Inspection and Cleaning

Before connecting patch cords, it is essential to inspect the end face using a microscope at 200x-400x magnification to detect scratches, debris, or contamination . The IEC 61300-3-35 standard defines pass/fail criteria for fiber end faces, including acceptable zones and defect limits. Both ends of a patch cord should be inspected, as contamination on either side can degrade performance. Even if OTDR testing is pla...
