Fiber optic cables can be installed in cable trays if they meet the appropriate NEC listings and mechanical requirements for the environment.

Regulatory Guidelines

According to the 2023 National Electric Code (NEC), fiber optic cables are permitted in cable trays under Article 770, Section 770-113(h). The NEC allows various types of optical fiber cables, including OFNP, OFCP, OFNR, OFCR, OFNG, OFCG, OFN, and OFC, to be supported in cable trays, provided any additional restrictions, such as plenum or riser ratings, are observed for specific environments like plenum spaces. Cable trays differ from raceways in that they are open, allowing easier access and installation, but require cables to withstand mechanical and environmental stresses.

Cable Types and Mechanical Considerations

Fiber optic tray cables (FOTC) are specifically designed for tray installations. These cables are tight-buffered and engineered to resist pulling forces, impact, crush, and bending stresses during installation and operation. For example, OCC's B-series tray cables are tested to withstand crush forces up to 2200 N/cm and extreme temperatures ranging from -50°C to +85°C, depending on jacket type, ensuring durability in both indoor and outdoor environments. Jackets often include UV-stabilizing compounds to prevent degradation from sunlight exposure....
