- **Support Spacing:** Flat steel should be supported at intervals consistent with the cable tray's load rating. Typically, cable tray supports are spaced at 1.2 meters (4 feet) maximum for standard runs, with additional support at bends, branches, or offsets.
- **Attachment:** The flat steel can be fixed to the tray supports using bolts, clamps, or welded connections, depending on the tray type and material. Ensure that the steel is aligned with the tray edges to avoid interference with cable routing.
- **Surface Protection:** If the flat steel is exposed to moisture or corrosive environments, it should be galvanized, stainless, or coated to prevent corrosion.
