

High-voltage power distribution box markings



Article Overview

High-voltage power distribution boxes must be clearly labeled with voltage ratings, hazard warnings, and identification information to ensure safety and regulatory compliance.

Key Labeling Requirements

Voltage and Hazard Warnings: All high-voltage equipment (typically above 1,000 V) must display a “DANGER—HIGH VOLTAGE—KEEP OUT” sign at entrances or on the equipment itself, as specified in NFPA 70, Section 110.34(C), and NEC Article 110.16 . Labels should indicate the nominal voltage and potential hazards to prevent accidental contact. **Color Coding:** Conduits and equipment should use standardized colors to indicate voltage levels. For example, emergency system conduits (4.16 kV and 2.4 kV) are marked red, while normal system conduits (13.8 kV) are marked yellow . OSHA Standard 29 CFR 1910.144 defines safety color codes for marking physical hazards . **Circuit Identification:** Each distribution box should have panel directories, circuit numbers, and load descriptions. Odd-numbered circuits are typically on the left or top, even-numbered on the right or bottom. Circuit numbers should be visible on breakers, panels, and conduits to facilitate maintenance and troubleshooting . **Label Permanence and Materials:** Labels must be durable and resistant to environmental conditions. Recommended materials include laminated plastic or engraved nameplates, with contrasting colors for readability. Heat-shrink tubular markers can be used for control wires, and labels should comply with ANSI/UL 969 or CSA C22.2 No. 0.15 for permanence . **Documentation and Updates:** Maintain...
