

Highway Law for Hanging Fiber Optic Cables



Article Overview

Installing fiber optic cables along highways requires compliance with federal, state, and local right-of-way laws, utility accommodation regulations, and safety standards.

Right-of-Way (ROW) Considerations

Fiber optic deployment along highways is governed by Right-of-Way (ROW) laws, which define the legal authority to install infrastructure on public or private property. ROW access may involve permits from local governments, state Departments of Transportation (DOTs), or utility companies, and often includes fees for pole or duct usage . Federal guidance encourages the use of highway ROW for broadband deployment to support Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) and other public infrastructure needs .

Federal Regulations

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) regulates utility accommodations on limited-access highways under 23 CFR Part 645, Subpart B. These regulations require that fiber optic installations:

- Do not impair highway safety or traffic flow
 - Maintain adequate clearances from energized conductors and road surfaces
 - Consider aesthetic quality and construction/maintenance costs
