

How many Mbps routers are needed for a 300 Mbps fiber optic connection

To fully utilize a 300 Mbps fiber optic connection, you need a router that supports at least 300 Mbps on both wired and wireless connections, ideally with gigabit Ethernet ports and modern Wi-Fi standards.

Wired and Wireless Considerations

For a 300 Mbps fiber connection, the router's WAN port should support at least 1 Gbps to avoid limiting your internet speed, as older routers with 100 Mbps ports will cap your throughput below the fiber plan's maximum . Similarly, the router's LAN ports should ideally be gigabit (1 Gbps) to ensure wired devices can achieve full speed . On the wireless side, routers using Wi-Fi 5 (802.11ac) or Wi-Fi 6/6E (802.11ax) are recommended. These standards can handle multiple devices simultaneously and provide sufficient bandwidth for high-speed streaming, gaming, and video conferencing . Wi-Fi 7 routers offer even higher throughput and are future-proof, but Wi-Fi 6 is sufficient for a 300 Mbps connection .

Device Load and Bandwidth Allocation

The number of devices and their usage patterns affect how much of the 300 Mbps you can actually use. For example, streaming a 4K video may require 25 Mbps, while web browsing or social media uses 1-5 Mbps per device . Using the 10 Mbps per device rule, a 300 Mbps connection can comfortably support around 30 devices if not all are performing high-bandwidth tasks simultaneously
