

How many distances are needed for fiber optic cold connectors

The required fiber length for cold connectors depends on the connector type and mechanical splice design, typically allowing a few millimeters of exposed fiber for proper alignment and insertion.

Fiber Preparation for Cold Connectors

Cold connectors, also called fast or mechanical connectors, do not require epoxy or polishing. Instead, they use a mechanical splice to join fibers. To install them correctly, the fiber must be stripped, cleaved, and aligned precisely. The exposed fiber length is usually just enough to fit into the connector's splice mechanism, often around 10-15 mm, depending on the connector model and manufacturer specifications.

Key Steps Affecting Fiber Length

- Stripping: Remove the protective coating without damaging the fiber. The stripped section must be long enough to reach the mechanical splice inside the connector.
- Cleaving: Cut the fiber cleanly to create a smooth end face. The cleave length should match the connector's splice chamber to ensure minimal insertion loss.
- Insertion and Alignment: The fiber is inserted into the connector, where an alignment mechanism ensures the cores are properly matched. Excess fiber beyond the splice chamber is trimmed if necessary.
