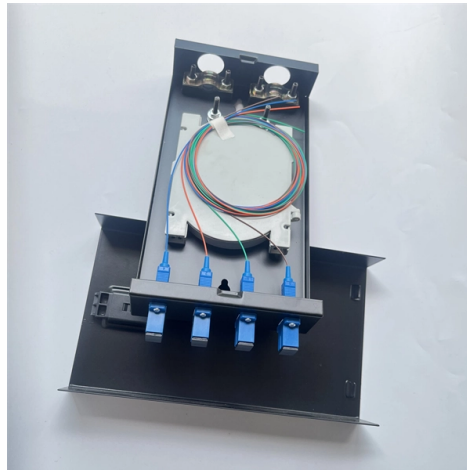


How many loops of fiber optic splice coil should be reserved



Overview

The rule is to coil the fiber once after each splicing and heat shrinking of one or several optical fibers in fiber optic sleeve or optical fibers in a branch direction optical cable. Fiber optic cable reel length planning is one of those LLD details that gets treated like an afterthought — right up until a project manager calls asking why the splice count doubled from the estimate. Poor fiber splicing, on the other hand, can lead to performance issues and increased maintenance costs. The scientific fiber coiling method can make the optical fiber layout reasonable, with low additional. Let's say I have a 48C loose tube fibre run, with 10 intermediate splice joints to connect 10 switches. Each switch requires 2 cores to connect to the SFP port.
