

# How many terminals does the core switch support



## Article Overview

A core switch can support anywhere from dozens to several hundred terminals, depending on the model, port density, and configuration.

### General Overview

Core switches are high-capacity devices designed to act as the backbone of a network, aggregating traffic from multiple distribution switches rather than connecting directly to end-user devices . The number of terminals (ports) a core switch supports depends on whether it is a fixed-port switch or a modular chassis-based switch. Fixed switches have a set number of ports, while modular switches allow expansion by adding line cards.

### Typical Port Capacities

Modern enterprise core switches, such as the Cisco Catalyst 9500X series, support a wide range of port types and densities:

- 10G, 25G, 40G, 50G, 100G, 200G, and 400G Ethernet ports .
- Nonblocking configurations with high-density SFP-56 or QSFP-DD ports allow hundreds of simultaneous connections.
- For example, a single Catalyst 9500X switch can support dozens of 400G ports or hundreds of 10G/25G ports, depending on the model and port configuration . Chassis-based core switches can further increase terminal support by adding multiple line c...
