

How to check if an optical module is compatible

To ensure an optical module is compatible, verify the vendor, form factor, fiber type, wavelength, firmware, and test it on the target device before deployment.

Step 1: Identify Module and Device Specifications

Start by gathering the exact part number, vendor, form factor (SFP, SFP+, QSFP), fiber type (single-mode or multi-mode), wavelength, and reach of the optical module. Check the host device specifications (switch, router, or NIC) for supported transceivers and any vendor restrictions . Many enterprise switches provide CLI commands to display module details, including serial number, firmware version, and DDM/DOM readings.

Step 2: Consult Compatibility Resources

Use vendor-provided compatibility matrices or online tools to confirm support. For example:

- Cisco offers an Optics-to-Device Compatibility Matrix for their switches .
- Third-party tools like OptiModule Compatibility Finder allow you to select your device model and find compatible transceivers .
- Check the manufacturer's optics support pages for firmware and vendor authentication requirements
