

How to connect a fiber optic pigtail

Connecting a fiber optic pigtail involves preparing the fiber, cleaning and cleaving it, fusion splicing to the main cable, and protecting the splice for a reliable, low-loss connection.

Understanding Fiber Optic Pigtails

A fiber optic pigtail is a short fiber cable with a factory-installed connector on one end and a bare fiber on the other. The connector end plugs into equipment like switches or patch panels, while the bare end is spliced to the main fiber line, creating a permanent, low-loss joint . Pigtails come in single-mode or multi-mode types and with various connectors such as LC, SC, ST, or FC .

Tools and Materials Needed

To connect a pigtail, you will need:

- Fusion splicer: Aligns and fuses the fibers for a low-loss connection .
- Fiber cleaver: Cuts the fiber ends cleanly at a precise 90° angle .
- Alcohol and lint-free wipes: Cleans the fiber ends to remove dust and oils .
- Heat-shrink sleeves or mechanical splice protectors: Protects the fused joint .
- Fiber stripper: Removes the outer jacket and coating to expose the bare fiber .

Step-by-Step Connection Process

- Slide on the protection sleeve: Place the heat-shrink sleeve on the fiber before splicing; it cannot be added afterward
