

How to ground the neutral busbar of the distribution box



Article Overview

The neutral busbar should be bonded to ground only in the main service panel, while in subpanels it must remain isolated from the ground busbar to ensure safety and proper circuit operation.

Neutral Busbar Function

The neutral busbar serves as the common return path for current from all branch circuits in a distribution box. It collects the returning current from devices and carries the unbalanced load between phases back to the utility transformer. In a main panel, the neutral busbar is typically connected to the panel's metal enclosure and the grounding system, creating a single point of reference to earth ground (EngineerFix) .

Grounding and Bonding Rules

According to the National Electrical Code (NEC), the neutral and ground wires must be bonded only at the main service panel or first service disconnect. This ensures that fault currents have a low-impedance path to trip protective devices, preventing electric shock or fire hazards (ElectricalTechnology) . In subpanels or downstream distribution boxes, the neutral busbar must remain isolated from the ground busbar to prevent return current from flowing on grounding conductors, which could create shock hazards (AzadTechHub) .
