

How to match optical modules with switches

Matching optical modules with switches requires verifying compatibility in speed, wavelength, fiber type, port type, and vendor support to ensure reliable network performance.

Key Factors for Compatibility

- **Module Type and Port Speed** Optical modules come in different types such as SFP (1G), SFP+ (10G), SFP28 (25G), QSFP+ (40G), and QSFP28 (100G). Ensure the module speed matches the switch port. For example, a 1G SFP cannot operate at full speed in a 10G-only SFP+ port, and vice versa, even if the form factor fits physically .
- **Wavelength Matching** Both ends of a fiber link must use modules with the same wavelength. A 1310nm module will not communicate with an 850nm module. Mismatched wavelengths can cause data loss or degraded performance .
- **Fiber Type** Verify whether the module is designed for single-mode (SMF) or multi-mode fiber (MMF). Using the wrong fiber type can result in signal attenuation or link failure .
- **Duplex Mode** Full-duplex modules must be paired with full-duplex modules. Connecting a full-duplex module to a half-duplex module will prevent data transmission .
- **Vendor Compatibility and Coding** Many switches, such as Cisco, HPE, Juniper, and Aruba, maintain Supported Transceiver Lists. Some vendors use EEPROM coding to verify module authenticity. Using a module not recognized by the switch may trigger alarms like “unsupported transceiver.” Third-party modules can be coded to match major brands for interoperability
