

How to separate the cores of outdoor optical cables



Article Overview

To separate the cores of outdoor optical cables, carefully remove the outer sheath, expose the buffer tubes, and handle each fiber individually while following proper safety and installation practices.

Step-by-Step Core Separation

- **Prepare Tools and Workspace** Gather approved tools such as a sheath knife, needle-nose pliers, and fiber handling equipment. Ensure the workspace is clean, dry, and free of dust to prevent contamination of fibers .
- **Mark and Cut the Outer Sheath** Measure the length of sheath to remove (typically 2 meters or as specified by your company). Use a sheath knife to make a circumferential “ring cut” around the cable, taking care not to damage the ripcord or strength members beneath the sheath .
- **Remove the Sheath** Flex the cable gently at the ring cut to separate the sheath. Pull back the ripcord using pliers to the first ring cut, then remove the split sheath to expose the cable core .
- **Expose the Cable Core** The core consists of color-coded buffer tubes stranded around a central strength member. These tubes are secured with binder strings. Carefully remove any binder strings to access individual buffer tubes .
- **Separate Individual Fibers** For loose tube cables, gently extract fibers from the buffer tubes. Avoid bending fibers beyond their minimum bend radius to prevent signal loss or breakage. For ribbon cables, separate ribbons as needed for splicing or termination .
- **Clean and Prepare Fibers for Termination or Splicing** Use alcohol wipes and lint-free...
