A fiber optic tray organizes, protects, and manages fiber cables for splicing and connectivity, ensuring proper routing, bend radius control, and secure installation.

Installing the Fiber Optic Tray

- **Mount the Tray Base:** Position the tray base on the wall or inside a fiber enclosure. Use screws or bolts to secure it firmly, ensuring it is level and stable ().
- **Prepare Cable Entry Points:** Most trays have U-shaped or centered fiber cable input holes. Drill these holes if they are undrilled, following the pre-marked outlines on the tray base ().
- **Secure the Fiber Cables:** Use cable fixture holes with straps or plastic ties to hold the fiber cables in place. Ensure cables are routed in a clockwise direction to prevent tangling or stress ().

Routing and Splicing Fibers

- **Organize Excess Fiber:** Coil any excess fiber neatly within the tray compartments, maintaining the minimum bend radius to prevent signal loss or fiber damage ().
- **Mechanical or Fusion Splicing:** Place fibers into the designated slots or compartments for splicing. Mechanical splicing aligns fibers using a mechanical device, while fusion splicing welds fibers together for a permanent connection ().
- **Protect Splices:** Ensure all spliced fibers are secured within the tray to prevent movement. Use protective covers or locking mechanisms provided with the tray ().

Final Steps

- **Attach the Protective Case:** Once fibers are routed and spliced, place the protective case over the tray and lock it in place. This prevents accidental damage and unauth...
