

Installation Requirements for Cable Trays in Underground Trench



Article Overview

Cable trays in underground trenches must follow NEC, IEC, and utility-specific standards for trench dimensions, bedding, backfill, spacing, grounding, and cable support to ensure safety, mechanical protection, and thermal performance.

Trench Dimensions and Layout

Underground cable trenches should be designed to accommodate the number and size of cables while allowing proper access for installation and maintenance. Typical guidelines include:

- Trench width and depth depend on cable size, voltage, and number of runs. For high-current services (2001–4000 A), trench lengths are often limited to 20 feet, with cable runs less than 50 feet from transformer to panel .
- Uniform trench bottom: Avoid grade changes or “chimneys” to maintain consistent cable support .
- Bedding: Lay 6 inches of 3/4-inch drain rock or sand at the trench base to protect cables from sharp stones and provide drainage .

Cable Tray Support and Spacing

- Support arms should be installed at regular intervals, typically every 30 inches, to secure the cable tray and prevent sagging .
- Cable ties are recommended at ± 15 -inch intervals along the cable run to maintain...
