Intentionally damaging communication facilities or fiber optic cables is a serious criminal offense with significant legal and operational consequences.

Legal Implications

Under 18 U.S. Code § 1362, it is illegal to willfully or maliciously injure, destroy, or interfere with any communication line, station, or system operated or controlled by the United States, particularly those used for military or civil defense purposes. Violations can result in fines, imprisonment for up to ten years, or both. The law also covers attempts or conspiracies to commit such acts, emphasizing the severity of intentional interference with critical communications infrastructure .

Operational and Economic Impact

Fiber optic cables are the backbone of modern connectivity, transmitting data at near-light speeds. Even minor physical damage—such as bending beyond the minimum radius, cutting, or scratching the fiber core—can cause signal loss, data errors, or complete service outages. For example, a small nick in a single-mode fiber can reduce its effective transmission range by half, potentially disrupting internet access for entire neighborhoods . Intentional damage can also result in millions of dollars in repair costs and prolonged downtime, affecting healthcare, education, finance, energy, and emergency services
