An FTTR beam splitter is an optical device used in Fiber to the Room networks to divide a single fiber signal into multiple outputs, enabling fiber connectivity to multiple rooms or devices.

Function in FTTR Networks

In FTTR (Fiber to the Room) systems, optical fibers are extended directly to individual rooms, providing high-speed, low-latency connectivity throughout a home or office . The beam splitter is a passive optical component that takes the incoming optical signal from the main ONT (Optical Network Terminal) and splits it into multiple outputs, which are then routed to edge ONTs in different rooms . This allows multiple devices or rooms to share a single fiber connection efficiently.

How It Works

FTTR beam splitters operate on the same principles as general optical beam splitters:

- They divide light into transmitted and reflected beams or multiple outputs.
- In some designs, Frustrated Total Internal Reflection (FTIR) is used, where light incident on a prism interface is partially transmitted through a thin gap, allowing precise control of the split ratio .
- In fiber networks, splitters are typically bidirectional and can split signals into ratios such as 1×32, 1×64, or 1×128, depending on network design and distance to the subscriber
