While typical home networks use low-power LEDs that are much weaker than industrial lasers, it is still unsafe to look directly into the end of a fiber unless you are certain no light is being transmitted. Infrared light in the 1300-1550 nm range is mostly absorbed by the cornea and lens, reducing retinal risk, but caution is still necessary .
