

Is it okay to bend the pigtail channel at a 90-degree angle



Article Overview

Bending a pigtail cable at a sharp 90-degree angle is generally not recommended unless the cable is specifically designed with a pre-manufactured right-angle configuration.

Mechanical and Electrical Considerations

Bending a standard pigtail sharply can damage the internal dielectric and conductor, leading to signal leakage, increased insertion loss, or even permanent deformation of the cable structure, especially in RF coaxial cables like RG8 or SMA pigtails . For USB-C or power pigtails, a sharp bend can concentrate stress at the solder joint, causing fatigue and eventual failure over time .

When 90-Degree Bends Are Acceptable

- Pre-manufactured 90-degree pigtails: These are designed to maintain the correct bend radius and distribute mechanical stress evenly, preserving impedance and signal integrity in RF applications .
- Tight-space installations: In confined enclosures, behind panels, or near perpendicular mounting surfaces, a 90-degree pigtail allows the cable to route neatly without kinking or stressing connectors .
- Gas or propane connections: Flexible pigtails are often bent at 90 degrees during installation to fit under tanks or in limited spaces, provided the bend is gradual and the cable is rated for such use
