

National Standards for Large Cable Trays



Overview

NEC Article 392 governs cable tray installations, covering tray types, fill limits, cable types permitted, and ampacity adjustments. The fill rules differ significantly between single-conductor cables and multiconductor cables, and between ladder tray and solid-bottom tray. Information on maintenance and system modification is also. Cable Types: Only use conductors rated for open-air environments, such as Tray Rated (Type TC) or Metal-Clad (Type MC) cables. Clearances: Maintain at least 12 inches of vertical clearance above trays for installation and maintenance access (2026 NEC update). The flexibility and scalability of cable trays make them an ideal choice for environments where cable density and organization can. The use and installation of cable trays is covered by legally enforceable OSHA regulations in 29 CFR 1910.305(a)(3), or comparable standards promulgated by States operating OSHA-approved State plans.
