

Optical cables entering the office should be selected

For office entry, choose indoor-rated, fire-resistant optical fiber cables with proper conduit protection, bend radius compliance, and clear labeling for safety and long-term reliability.

Cable Type Selection

For optical cables entering an office, indoor-rated fiber optic cables are recommended. These cables are designed to be flexible, cost-effective, and fire-resistant to comply with building safety codes, such as plenum (OFNP) or riser (OFNR) ratings depending on the installation environment . If the cable originates from an outdoor environment, a transition from outdoor to indoor cable should be made at the entrance point, often using a rigid or intermediate metallic conduit to protect the cable and maintain grounding compliance .

Conduit and Entrance Considerations

The point of entry should be carefully planned to avoid sharp bends and excessive stress on the cable. Conduits should be sized appropriately (e.g., trade size 2 or 4) to accommodate the cable diameter and any innerducts for smaller cables . Pull boxes may be required if the conduit run includes multiple bends exceeding the equivalent of two 90-degree turns . Ensure the conduit is grounded according to NEC and NESC standards....
