

Quota for dismantling cable trays



Article Overview

When dismantling cable trays, maintain a fill capacity of 40–50% of the tray cross-sectional area to ensure safety and prevent cable damage.

Recommended Fill Capacity

Cable tray fill is governed by electrical codes such as NEC Article 392, which limits the total cable area to 40% for power cables and 50% for control, signal, or communication cables relative to the tray's cross-sectional area (width × depth) to allow proper heat dissipation and mechanical stability . This ensures that cables are not overcrowded during dismantling or reinstallation.

Handling and Safety Considerations

- **Spacing and Support:** Maintain proper spacing between cables and tray edges. Use tie wraps, cleats, or metal straps to secure cables, especially for larger conductors over 25 mm² .
- **Tray Preparation:** Inspect the tray for corrosion or damage before dismantling. Protect cut edges and ensure suspension rods or brackets are properly handled to avoid injury .
- **Cable Protection:** Avoid bending cables below their minimum bend radius and prevent physical damage during removal. Handle reels and coils carefully using cranes, slings, or forklifts as appropriate .
- **Reserve Margin:** Allow a 25% reserve margin in tray size and weight to accommodate unforeseen conditions during dismantling
