Contamination from dust, fingerprints, or oil can prevent proper end-face contact, leading to high insertion loss or permanent damage . Poor field termination, air gaps, or scratches on the fiber end-face can also compromise fusion quality. Additionally, incorrect polarity or faulty fusion splices can result in signal degradation .
