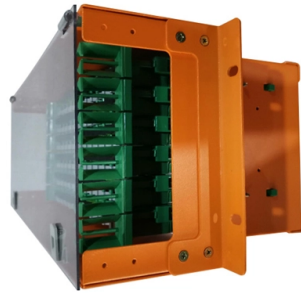


Secondary protection requirements for distribution boxes

Key Components of Secondary Protection

1. Grounding and Protective Earth: All metallic parts of the distribution box, including the electrical installation board and appliance casings, must be reliably grounded. This prevents electric shock in case of insulation failure and ensures that fault currents are safely directed to earth, reducing the risk of injury or fire . 2. Residual Current Devices (RCDs) / Leakage Protectors: A leakage protector should be installed to detect earth faults and disconnect the circuit quickly. This provides protection against electric shock and complements primary overcurrent protection devices like fuses or circuit breakers . 3. Isolation Switches / Disconnectors: Isolation switches, also known as disconnector switches, allow the complete de-energization of circuits for safe maintenance, inspection, or repair. These switches are essential for secondary protection, ensuring that personnel can safely work on the system without risk of accidental energization . 4. Double Insulation and Covers: Live parts within metallic distribution boards must be covered or insulated to prevent accidental contact. Double insulation is required for added safety, particularly in environments where the box may be accessible to untrained personnel . 5. Environmental Protection: Distribution boxes should be installed in dry, well-ventilated areas away from humidity, dust, or corrosive environments. For industrial or outdoor applicatio...
