

Sequence of High-Voltage Distribution Cabinets



Article Overview

High-voltage distribution systems typically follow the sequence: Incoming Cabinet → Metering Cabinet → Feeder Cabinet, with optional PT and Tie Cabinets for monitoring and interconnection.

1. Incoming Cabinet

The incoming cabinet is the first point of entry for high-voltage electricity from the power grid or upstream substation. Its primary role is to carry the total load and provide a disconnection point for maintenance or fault conditions. It usually contains a Vacuum Circuit Breaker (VCB) for high-voltage systems, current transformers (CTs) for measurement, surge arresters for overvoltage protection, and an integrated protection relay to monitor overcurrent, zero-sequence, and other signals, issuing trip commands when necessary .

2. Metering Cabinet

The metering cabinet is positioned after the incoming cabinet and before the feeder cabinet. Its main function is to accurately measure electrical energy consumption. It houses voltage transformers (PTs) and current transformers (CTs) with high accuracy (typically 0.2S or 0.5S) and avoids any switching components to prevent interference with measurements. This ensures all outgoing current is recorded correctly for billing and monitoring purposes
