

Should the core switch be used as a gateway



Article Overview

A core switch is not inherently a gateway, but it can host gateway interfaces in certain network designs.

Core Switch Function

A core switch is a high-capacity, high-performance Layer 3 switch positioned at the backbone of a network. Its primary role is to aggregate traffic from distribution switches and provide ultra-fast packet forwarding across the network, ensuring low latency and high throughput. Core switches handle internal routing within the LAN and act as the central aggregation point, but they are not automatically the exit point for a subnet.

Gateway Function

A gateway serves as the exit point for a subnet, connecting it to other networks or the internet. It typically manifests as a VLAN interface (VLANIF) or a router interface configured for Layer 3 forwarding. Gateways interpret and forward traffic between different network segments or protocols, which is a distinct function from the high-speed switching performed by core switches.
